How is the NEWSRAC Community Response Going?

The Editors are pleased to report that all feedback received indicates that it is going very well. The rapid availability of the Volunteer network following the Government announcement was reassuring, and any fear that there might be more requests than volunteer availability has proved groundless.

Indeed, members of the community are encouraged to ask, if they need support or help with shopping, picking up prescribed medication etc. The organisers have found that it is best to have one person going to a destination on a particular day, rather than several people, so arrangements are in place to ensure that there is someone on duty to provide support every day. (Sundays for emergencies) It is very likely that this person would respond to your request.

The organisers are keen to find out if people in the community would benefit from any other type of help. Everyone is finding ways to cope in their own way – whether by having tasks on a particular day, taking up hobbies etc. or, if in doubt, phone a friend. As an example, however, there could be cases where someone is really missing family members, but is struggling to use the on-line technology to have a video call. If this is an issue, please tell someone and it may be possible to provide some help.
